



A Parent's Guide to **DATA**

DATA's mission is to engage students in digital arts as a way to encourage them to graduate and to prepare them for post-secondary education and the work world.

DATA operates as a school within a school, in that DATA students travel together in core content classes that are heavily embedded with technology in a college preparatory curriculum. Last spring DATA received a California Partnership Grant from the California Department of Education.

DATA offers courses in Contemporary Media, Media Literacy, Journalism, Digital Photography, Digital Imaging, Animation, English, History, Mathematics and Science.

In the junior year, DATA students are paired with media mentors, and in their senior year, students have an opportunity to participate in a media internship. DATA has established partnerships with Time Warner Cable, KMIR, CBS2, Morris Desert Media, the Desert Sun, Palm Springs Art Museum, Palm Springs Studio, Palm Springs Life, Byford Entertainment, Tolerance Education Center, Casablanca Studios, Dual Media Advertising, Epidemic Skate Shop, and Kaminsky Productions.

Students apply to the Academy during the spring of their freshmen year, and if accepted, they travel with other DATA students for three academic courses and a DATA elective during the sophomore and junior years. In their senior year, DATA students are enrolled in Senior English and one DATA elective.

Academy teachers have common preparatory periods in which they share curriculum ideas and monitor student academic progress and individual issues. By senior year, many of our students are clear about what major they would like to pursue and what college will best accommodate their career goals.

DATA: A Unique Opportunity

Students in DATA have some amazing opportunities: media mentorships and internships, project-based core and elective classes, a designated guidance counselor, access to state-of-the-art technology, college and museum field trips, scholarships, student exhibitions, job networking, and preferred graduation processional placement.

The DATA Strands

After students successfully complete the Media Literacy course, they select either the *Journalism* or *Digital Imaging* Strands. These strands offer a more in-depth study of their related industries.

Journalism provides students with the opportunity to use their literacy and technical skills to create news and documentary projects that reflect industry news media standards. Print and video projects created in this strand can be viewed on the DATA main web site at: **www.digitalartstechacademy.us** and **www.digitalartstechnologyacademy.blogspot.com**. In the past, journalism students have interviewed major civil rights activists, best-selling authors, and one of the first Marine Companies that returned from the Iraq War.

Digital Imaging provides students with a range of dynamic technology-based visual arts projects, which integrate digital photography, Photoshop, web media, and 2D/3D graphics & animation. The digital imaging classroom consists of green screen and traditional lighting areas, digital cameras, animation light boxes, and cutting edge software. In addition to exercising iLife '09, students develop skills using Adobe Photoshop, After Effects, Cinema 4D, Aperture, and Web 2.0 tools to create imagery for fine arts, graphic design, digital compositing, digital photography, 2D/3D animation, or web.

Acceptable Use Agreement

Students and parents/guardians need to be aware of the responsibilities that come along with these opportunities. The equipment is expensive, so students/guardians are responsible for any damaged equipment including but not limited to computers, cameras, and audio recording devices. When using school computers, students may not access any web sites or materials that are not class related. All students are subject to the PSUSD Acceptable Use Policy. Student use of technology as prescribed in the PSUSD Educational Technology Plan must be exercised by DATA students at all times. Unacceptable use of technology will result in disciplinary action.

On-Line/Internet Services: User Obligations and Responsibilities

- 1. The student, in whose name an on-line services account is issued, is responsible for its proper use at all times. An account will be issued only after the student has signed an Acceptable Use Agreement. Students shall keep personal account numbers, home addresses and telephone numbers private. They shall use the system only under their own account number.
- 2. Students shall use the district's system responsibly for educational purposes.
- 3. Students shall not access, post, submit, publish or display harmful or inappropriate matter that is threatening, obscene, disruptive or sexually explicit, or that could be construed as harassment or disparagement of others based on their race/ethnicity, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion or political beliefs.
- 4. Students shall not disclose, use or disseminate personal identification information about themselves or others when using electronic mail, chat rooms, or other forms of direct electronic communication. Personal information includes the student's name, address, telephone number, Social Security number, or other individually identifiable information.
- 5. Students shall not use the system to encourage the use of drugs, alcohol or tobacco, nor shall they promote unethical practices or any activity prohibited by law or Board policy.
- 6. Copyrighted material shall not be placed on the system without the author's permission. Students may download copyrighted material for their own use only.
- 7. Students shall not intentionally upload, download or create computer viruses and/or maliciously attempt to harm or destroy district equipment or materials or manipulate the data of any other user, including so-called "hacking."
- 8. Students shall not read other users' electronic mail or files. They shall not attempt to interfere with other users' ability to send or receive electronic mail, nor shall they attempt to delete, copy, modify or forge other users' mail.
- 9. Students shall report any security problem or misuse of the services to the teacher or principal.

Equipment/Software: Student Obligations and Responsibilities

- 1. Students shall not copy software owned by the District.
- 2. Students shall not download and/or install personal software on District equipment.
- 3. Students shall not connect personally owned peripheral devices to any District equipment without prior authorization by the Superintendent's designee.
- 4. Students shall not vandalize District equipment.
- 5. Students shall follow District procedures for checking-out portable devices for educational purposes.

Behavior Agreement

DATA classes are project-oriented, so students must maintain a professional demeanor at all times, which can be found in the quiet but productive working environments of radio, television, newspapers, magazines, or photography graphics studios.

Students unable to contribute to a productive working environment will be placed on a behavior contract and may be suspended from the DATA program.

Commitment to Graduate

Students not maintaining normal progress toward graduation will be required to attend a study hall/tutorial to make up missing work. Students must have an overall 2.5 GPA in core classes and a 3.0 average in DATA elective classes during sophomore and junior year to qualify for a senior internship. Seniors are required to complete 20 intern hours in order to earn the DATA graduation sash and walk with the DATA seniors in the ceremony

Field trips, mentorships, and internships are not guaranteed. Students will be evaluated for participation based on grades, behavior, professional attire and commitment to DATA.

DATA students will partner with SkillsUSA, a national nonprofit organization that fosters citizenship, employability and occupational skills through career-focused education and industry partnerships.

Introduction

The purpose of this activity is to show students how to use Career Matchmaker, an interactive career interest inventory. In particular, students will learn how Career Matchmaker provides individualized feedback on their career choices.

Setting the Stage

Classroom discussion can focus on how career assessments should be seen as tools for finding suitable careers, rather than as "tests" that supply the "final word" on students' futures. Students should be encouraged to answer the second round of Career Matchmaker questions for the best results. Students should also be encouraged to answer the questions based on what they enjoy doing rather than what they are good at.
