CREATING A RUBRIC FOR COMPOSING A PRESENTATION

1. Use the following elements for a *Composing a Presentation* rubric:

	LIMITED	DEVELOPING	PROFICIENT	ADVANCED	EXEMPLARY
Creates a convincing, authoritative argument.					
Exhibits creativity in composition.					
Puts information in own words.					
Develops main ideas and organizing concepts.					
Provides sufficient evidence to support claims.					
Provides examples and concrete details.					

2. Add descriptors depicting what students do as they develop the presentation expertise needed to complete the project. Here is an example of criteria for the first element of the rubric:
